





"4M IQ" — Life's Four Most Important Questions

Q1 - What is reality?

A - The Kingdom of God.

"Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand."

Q2 - Who is well off - living the good life?

A - Living in the direct availability of the Kingdom of God.

"Blessed are the ____, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven."

Q3 - Who is a good person?

A - One permeated with agape love.

"Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

Q4 - How do I become a good person?

A - Become an apprentice of Jesus.

Q - 4M IQ #3 - Who is a good person?

A – "One permeated with Agape love."

THE DIVINE CONSPIRACY

Who is a really good person?

He actually knows how to enable people to be good...a heartfelt love toward all...not acts and projects, but a pervasive condition of vision, joy and love in which we habitually reside...the same quality of God's love...perfect as our Father in the heavens is perfect.

The Human Condition — We want to be good but we are ready to do evil, and we come prepared with lengthy justifications.

A little girl in Sunday School is asked,

"What is a lie?"

"An abomination to God...

and a very present help in time of trouble."

Talk on the Hill

Masterful unity of the Sermon not laws, otherwise, Jesus is meaner than Moses.

"Repent, for life in the Kingdom of the Heavens is now one of your options." (Mt. 4:17 par)

The Genius — The Brilliant Teacher on the Hill

In our culture, Jesus is automatically disassociated from brilliance or intellectual capacity - "Master of those who know." Would you be able to trust your life to such a person...be inclined to become His student?

The Law and the Soul

Goodness = the <u>Source</u> (the Heart) of rightness, the Law is the <u>Course</u> of rightness (142)

Matthew 5:17-20 - Beyond Religious Professionals

The Law written on their kingdom hearts Jeremiah 31:33, Hebrews 10:16

Righteousness = "True Inner Goodness" (145)

A Thief is not just one who steals.

A Thief is one who would steal if the opportunity presents itself.

"If you just try to do the right thing or not do the wrong thing, you will fail. You have to go to a deeper level of the self than controlling the action. This is the crux of the matter. The intention has to be applied at the right place."



THE DIVINE CONSPIRACY

"In the Caldron of Anger & Contempt"

Anger — "#@% *!"

Jesus' understanding of them [anger & contempt] and their role in life becomes the basis for His strategy for establishing Kingdom goodness. It is the elimination of anger and contempt that He presents as the first and fundamental step toward the rightness of the Kingdom heart.



The Kingdom Heart

We do not control outcomes and are not responsible for them, but only for our contribution to them.

By truly loving our adversary, we stand within the reality of God's Kingdom and resources, and it is very likely we will draw our adversary into it also. Things are really different there, and a resolution manifesting the divine presence becomes possible.



See what will happen.
Venture on the Kingdom.
That is how we 'seek' it.

The Kingdom Heart

Standing in the Kingdom*, we make responsible decisions in love, with assurance that how things turn out for us does not really matter that much because, in any case, we are in the Kingdom of the Heavens...nothing that can happen to us is the 'end of the world'.



* i.e., "Beatitudinal Living"

In this way, you take on the nature of your Father, the One in the Heavens.

Goodness is Love - Agape Love - a Kingdom Heart We discover love as a life power. (182)

Hard to do? He calls us to Him to impart Himself to us. He does not call us to do what He did, but to be as He was, permeated with love. (183)

The deeds of love, including loving our enemies, are what agape love does in us and what we do as the new persons we have become. (184)

Intellectual Vacuum — There is now no recognized moral knowledge upon which projects of fostering moral development could be based. (Chapter 1, p. 3)




This is the outcome of the now centuries long effort to develop a moral guide to life within the framework of human thought and experience alone... unassisted by revelation.

By contrast, the Christian teaching about moral goodness that derives from the principles laid down by Jesus does have a historical, theoretical, and practical claim to constitute the true body of moral knowledge.



Jesus, the Master and Maestro of true goodness, teaches and enables us through His Kingdom to be filled with the "agape" love of God in our every day, ordinary life.







