


Here are a few suggestions on how to make the most of this course.

- 1) READ each assigned section slow enough to capture the depth of insights. See the course schedule (next page) for the designated section. A separate 2023 course reading schedule was sent to you upon registration.
- 2) REVIEW each session's outline and scriptures adding your own notes to contribute to each session.
- 3) VIEW Complement reading with teachings from Dallas Willard's 12 session series, "The Divine Conspiracy Lecture Series". You will find 117 pages of notes from this series in the Jesus College Library. Discover a growing library of teachings on the Dallas Willard Ministries YouTube channel.
- 4) SHARE Offer questions and comments that stood out in your personal study with Jesus and Dallas in the Word. Enter them in the Q&A tool on the bottom of the Zoom screen during the session. Linger longer for the post "Q&C" time.

What a Kingdom Is (21-22)

"Every last one of us has a "kingdom" - or a "queendom" or a "government" - a realm that is uniquely our own, where our choice determines what happens. Our kingdom is simply the range of our effective will. What we genuinely have a say over is within our kingdom." (21)

God's "Creation Covenant" with Human Beings" (22-23) Genesis 1:28-30

"The Human Job Description - The Creation Covenant" - God assigned to us collectively the rule over all living things on earth. We are meant to exercise our rule only with God. Learning life as a branch - John 15

The Case of the Missing Teacher - "Wisdom not information" (55) "We don't look to Jesus as wise teacher so we don't see ourselves as His students/disciples." (57)

The disappearance of Jesus as teacher explains why today in Christian churches little effort is made to teach people to do what He did and taught. We do not seriously consider Jesus as our teacher on how to live, hence we can not think of ourselves, in our moment-to-moment existence, as His students or disciples.

The absence from our churches of Jesus as teacher...is largely caused and sustained by the basic message that we constantly hear from Christian pulpits - "gospels of sin management". Jesus invitation to eternal life now - right in the middle of work business, and profession - remains for the most part ignored and unspoken. (57)

The resources of God's kingdom remain detached from human life. There is no gospel for human life and Christian discipleship, just one for death or one for social action. To counteract this we must develop a straightforward presentation, in word and life, of the reality of life now under God's rule, through reliance upon the word and person of Jesus. In this way we can naturally become His students or apprentices. We can learn from Him how to live our lives as He would live them if He were we. We can enter His eternal kind of life now." (58)

God's Joyous Being (62-64)

"Jesus good news about the kingdom can be an effective guide for my life only if I share His view of the world. It's a world filled with a glorious reality, where every component is in God's direct knowledge and control. It's a world inconceivably beautiful and good because of God and because He's always in it...where's He's continually at play and over which He constantly rejoices. **Until my thoughts of God have found every visible thing and event glorious in His presence, the words of Jesus have not yet fully seized me."** (61-62)

Finding Language to Express This Great God (64-66)

"It is, frankly, hard today to think adequately of God, or perhaps to think of Him at all." (64)

"To trust in God, we need a rich and accurate way of thinking about Him to support our life vision and will." (65)

The Kingdom Among Us

Spiritual Zeros under Heaven's Care (100-102) Matthew 4:19-23

"The poor in spirit are called 'blessed' by Jesus, not because they are in a meritorious condition, but because, precisely in spite of and in the midst of their ever so deplorable condition, the rule of the heavens has moved redemptively upon and through them by the grace of Christ." (102)

Staying in Charge (102-103)

"Propriety" - Trying to engineer our way into the Kingdom - to secure blessedness (103) "If not salvation by works, then possibly salvation by attitude."

What about those not on the list? - If you are not on the list, you're not in the Kingdom (104) "Seek to become poor, sad, persecuted...but very few actually do this." (104) Surely this is not what Jesus had in mind when He taught this!

Conclusion - The Beatitudes - For Today or Not?

"They [Beatitudes] are explanations and illustrations, drawn from the immediate setting, of the present availability of the kingdom through personal relationship to Jesus...in life circumstances that are beyond all hope." "The Beatitudes simply cannot be 'good news' if they are understood as a set of how-to's for achieving blessedness. They would only then amount to a new legalism." (106)

This what Jesus did by the way he taught. He tied his teachings to concrete events that make up the hearers' lives. He aimed his sayings at their hearts and habits as these were revealed in their daily lives."

"Jesus not only taught in this manner, he also taught us, his students in the Kingdom, to teach in the same way. By showing to others the presence of the kingdom in the concrete details of our shared existence, we impact the lives and hearts of our hearers, not just their heads. And the won't have to write it down to hold onto it." (114)

Anger

"Jesus understanding of them [anger & contempt] and their role in life becomes the basis for His strategy for establishing Kingdom goodness. It is the elimination of anger and contempt that He presents as the first and fundamental step toward the rightness of the Kingdom heart." (147)

1. "Spontaneously arises when our will is obstructed"

Anger - "a feeling...toward interfering with, and possibly even harming, those who have thwarted our will and interfered with our life." "The preliminary function of anger in life is to alert me to an obstruction to my will." (147)

2. "It includes a will to harm them"

"We know that people who are angry at us will our harm." "Some degree of malice is contained in every degree of anger. That is why it always hurts us when someone is angry at us." (148)

3. "We choose or will to be angry"

"We can actively receive it and decide to indulge it, and we usually do. We may even become an angry person...rage in constant readiness." (148) "Find a person who has embraced anger and you find a person with a wounded ego - the importance of the self." (149)

"There is nothing that can be done with anger than cannot be done better without it." (151)

Contempt

"Worse than anger." "Contempt makes it easier for us to hurt them or see them further degraded." (151) Contempt means to *Exclude - Push away - Leave out - Isolate*

"Contemptuous actions and attitudes are a knife in the heart that permanently harms and mutilates people's souls." (152) "Contempt spits on this pathetically deep need [to belong]." (153) "You fool!" - Combines all that is evil in anger and contempt" (154)

Prohibitions not Laws

"Jesus is working, at the much deeper level of the source of actions - good and bad." "No one can be right in the Kingdom sense who is not transformed at this level." "I treasure those around me and see them as God's creatures designed for His eternal purposes." "Graceful relationship sustained with the masterful Christ certainly can [reach the heart]." (155)

Kingdom Living

"We do not control outcomes and are not responsible for them, but only for our contribution to them." "Venture on the Kingdom. That is how we 'seek' it." (157) "Standing in the Kingdom, we make responsible decisions in love, with assurance that how things turn out for us does not really matter that much because, in any case, we are in the Kingdom of the Heavens...nothing that can happen to us is the 'end of the world'." (158)

Anger + Contempt = destroyed marriage sex = fantasy (163-164)

"Thinking of or tempted by sex is not wrong" vs. "Looking to desire her"

"A choice becomes a chosen habit. It is not the law of gravity." (165)

Attraction ~ Distraction ~ Action

Life Area #3 - Divorce (5:31-32)

"Kingdom hearts are not hard." (172)

- 1) Divorce was never God's intention.
- 2) A right divorce is not good.
- 3) Divorce perpetuates adultery in a degraded sexual condition of neglect or prostitution.

So that You...

Be Not Judged - "Counterattack" or "Reciprocity" (223)

Eliminate Condemnation then Help - "The Log Eye"

Judging and Discerning - "The Appraiser" & "The Approval Seeker"

"When we enter the life of friendship with the Jesus who is now at work in our universe, we stand in a new reality where condemnation is simply irrelevant. It seems only intelligent just to have done with the whole condemning game." (227)

- "Nothing has power to tempt me or move me to wrong action that I have not given power by what I permit to be in me." (344)
- **3. Training** "The training required...will not be done for us. Yet it is something we cannot do by ourselves." (John 15:5) "We must act wisely and consistently over a longer period of time." "We must not do this as if the new life were simply our project. God is at work in us." (345-346)

THE DIVINE CONSPIRACY 365

A daily read through Dallas Willard's *The Divine Conspiracy* by Doug Webster

INTRODUCTION

Here are 365 gems from a life altering, world changing, eternity revealing treatise on what Dallas Willard presents as the message of the gospel of Jesus Christ — access to life in the Kingdom of God Among Us now at hand. Willard intends to elevate the most intelligent, smartest person in history to His rightful and appropriate position as history's greatest and most profound Master Teacher.

The objective of *The Divine Conspiracy* ("The Book") is to help the reader as an Apprentice of Jesus, "Learn how to live my life as He would live my life if He were I." (p. 282) Through this transformational training, you and I will become the kind of people who will naturally and readily do what Jesus commanded. In so doing, we will become a Kingdom Man, a Kingdom Woman, a prince or princess of the King and sibling of the Savior who lives the Sermon on the Mount. In so doing, God will raise up a trinitarian community of love with God at the center. Kingdom Families and Kingdom Communities as Churches will form naturally.

The Content — The Book is divided into 365 "Sections". Each of the sections are direct quotes from The Book. There are approximately 390 pages in the hardback, so each Section is portions from about 1 1/2 pages of The Book.

The Reflection — Each section offers a few words, most often in the form of questions, for you to consider how to live out a message drawn from the particular part of The Book. The form of the reflection is drawn from one of the three key areas of application from The Book, namely the V-I-M: Vision - Intention - Means. To best reflect upon what you read is to enact Dallas Willard's definition of "repent: think about your thinking. Have a thought about your thoughts in the light of this new fact that the rule of God is now immediately available for you to live in." To better repent is to move the word solely from its common, if not sole position in "guilt", (although that may accompany your reflection), to a place of "growth" in grace. To grow in grace to more effectively and fruitfully repent requires a much broader, richer understanding of what grace means. That requirement can be found most powerfully and practically in your journey through The Book.

The Journey — I consider The Book to be the second best book ever published, second to what has often times been called The Big Book - The Bible. I recommend readers not simply read the *The Divine Conspiracy*, but as some have suggested as can be the case with other wise, insightful, challenging great writers like C.S. Lewis — "receive the book". To receive a book takes time. For that reason, you now have a guide to spend the next year reading through The Book. I go as far to advise you spend the next decade reading it. If this is your first time through *The Divine Conspiracy*, you will build a strong foundation of life with Jesus through his Sermon on the Mount upon which you can expand another nine years. Remember, the purpose is to become more like Jesus Christ not finish reading a book.

Maximizing the Journey — A final recommendation: Take three things along with you for the next year: The Bible, a Journal, and a Friend or three. Keep the Word of God — The Big Book, the best book ever published — close at hand, literally referring back and forth as you see Dallas reference scripture. Journaling may be as simple as notes in the margin of The Book's printed pages. Journaling may be a written prayer following your reading. A bound notebook or adding lined pages to a 3 ring notebook are two simple and affordable ways to maximize your journey. Of course, typing your thoughts into a software program for posterity and future study will offer you accessible means by which to re-visit your observations, especially months later, through an easy word search in your document. A third recommendation is to not take the journey solo. Invite a friend to be your "Emmaus Partner" as you two (or few) walk with Emmanuel inviting Him to reveal everything about Himself in the Scriptures. (Luke 24:13-32)

The Invitation — This 365 day format is intentionally simple. The Book's content is deep and challenging enough. In the simplicity of a daily layout, you are offered clarity, brevity, and manageability to flesh out mere Christlikeness over the next year. Consider the word "mere" defined as "that is solely or no more or better than what is specified." It can also present "the smallest or slightest." When you place the word "Mere" before the word "Christianity" you realize there is tremendous depth of understanding to clarify something to its "mere" level, for it becomes not smaller, but more defined in Vision, more direct in Intention, and more daily in Means of application. The "mere" form becomes the case where there is no more or better way to present than what is already specified.

The Prayer — It is my prayer before the King that you will find the same enriched, life changing, fresh hearing of Jesus as I and countless others have following as an Apprentice after the Master through *The Divine Conspiracy*. I pray your daily prayer will be merely, "Our Father, your Kingdom come, your will be done in and through me today as it is in the Heavens where you reign, where what you want done is done."
