Q2 - Who is well off - living the good life?

A - Living in the direct availability of the Kingdom of God.

“Blessed are the _____, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven.”

Q3 - Who is a good person?

A - One permeated with agape love.

“Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.”

Q4 - How do I become a good person?

A - Become an apprentice of Jesus.

Every student devoted to simply and solely following Jesus as guided by our senior apprentice Dallas Willard will do well to make these 6 paragraphs a staple in one's studious, diligent, daily journey through the Sermon on the Mount.

No Condemnation

Matthew 7:1-12 Kingdom Agape toward others

In the first 12 verses of Matthew 7, [Jesus] deals with the deadly way in which we try to “manage” or control those closest to us by blaming and condemning them and by forcing upon them our “wonderful solutions” for their problems. This too is a sure way of stepping outside the Torah, the Logos, the Kingdom Among Us and undertaking to manage our world on our own. Disaster awaits... (216)

In the power of the Kingdom, we must abandon the deeply rooted condemning and blaming. (217)

Once Again, the Centrality of the Order

Matthew 7:1-12 Kingdom Agape toward others

“Therefore” in v. 12 refers to 1-11, “In His Kingdom life, we extend respect to others that we would naturally hope others would extend to us.”

Agape Love is...

- 1.) Not condemning or blaming others (Mt. 7:1-5)
- 2.) Not forcing “wonderful things” upon them (v. 6)
- 3.) Asking what we want from them & God.(v. 7-11)

“Copping an Agape Attitude”

Who Can “Correct” Others

“Brothers & Sisters, if someone really is caught in a sin, the spiritual ones among you are the ones to restore him. Do it in a lowly and non-presumptuous spirit, considering yourselves, lest you too be put to the test. Feel the weight others are feeling, and thus you will fulfill Christ’s teaching.” Galatians 6:1

- 1) Sin confirmed
- 2) By the Mature
- 3) For Restoration
- 4) Without Contempt!





Condemnation with Anger & Contempt

The decision to step aside from [condemnation], neither giving it nor receiving it, is a major turning point in one's life. Of course, more than half the battle with condemnation is won once we have given up anger and contempt. Condemnation is such an easy way of hurting people deeply. (221)

Condemnation...a stinging attack, a shocking assault...often grows into shame. (222)

“In the Caldron of Anger & Contempt”

Flashback Chapter 5

Anger — “# @% *!”

Jesus’ understanding of them [anger & contempt] and their role in life becomes the basis for His strategy for establishing Kingdom goodness. It is the elimination of anger and contempt that He presents as the first and fundamental step toward the rightness of the Kingdom heart.

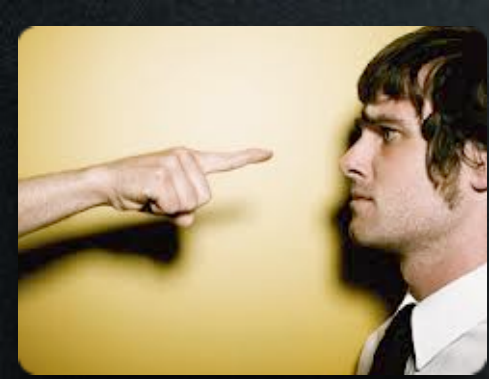

The Power of Condemnation

It also explains why the gospel of the Kingdom has such transforming power in human life. For that gospel opens the Kingdom to everyone, no matter the classification, and it enables us to become a different kind of person, beyond all condemnation, blame, and shame, and to know it.

When Good Things Becomes Deadly (228-231)

“Of Dogs & Hogs” - Matthew 7:6

Our practice of ‘condemnation engineering’...usually goes hand in hand with another device mistakenly used to manage the lives of those we truly care about...the practice of pushing things of God upon them whether they want or are ready for them or not.

What we are actually doing with our proper condemnation and our wonderful solutions is taking others out of their own responsibility and out of God’s hands and trying to bring them under our control.

7 Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. 8 For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened.

9 Which of you, if your son asks for bread, will give him a stone? 10 Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake? 11 If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him!

The Request — The Heart of the Community (231-239)

“Ask, Seek, Knock” - Matthew 7:7-12

As long as I'm condemning my friends or relatives, or pushing my “pearls” on them, I'm their problem.

But, once I back away, maintaining a sensitive and non-manipulative presence, I am no longer their problem. As I listen, they do not have to protect themselves from me and they begin to open up. I am no longer trying to drive them, genuine communication, real sharing of hearts, becomes an attractive possibility. (231)

On Not Getting What We Ask For

Two types of causation:

- 1) Under our control
- 2) Not under our control - Works thru request

Jesus did not just fix Peter. He prayed.

“That your faith may not die.” (Luke 22:32)

Perhaps no other scene in all of scripture forcefully portrays the community of prayerful love as this response to Peter. (240)



7 Teachings on Prayer in the Cosmic Setting

- 1) Prayer is basically request (243)
- 2) Praying Life - Praise & Thanksgiving. (243)
- 3) Changing God - Responds to desire and will. (244)
- 4) A Universe Responsive to Personality - Asking that they do something that one cannot do oneself. (246-249)
- 5) Prayer trains us to reign in His Kingdom. (250)
- 6) Prayer teaches us to wait for God to move. (252)
- 7) God's Dignity - The Most Moved Mover who lives with us and whom we approach from within the community of prayerful love. (253)





5 Requests in the Lord's Prayer

† Hallowed be Thy Name

Let your name be sanctified. (258)

† Thy Kingdom Come

Asking for God's rule, to be in effect. (260)

† Give Bread Daily


Today I have God and He has the provisions. (261)

† Don't Punish Us for Wrong

Jesus teaches us to ask for pity. (264-265)

† Don't Put us to the Test

A vote of 'no confidence' in our own abilities. (265)
