



Our Hearing Problem

Many sincere Christians [are] on the "outside looking in". They are not necessarily lacking the experience of hearing God, but they do not understand the language or how their experience works.



Dallas learned personally...

- ...by experience in revival meetings interacting with thought and impulse—God moving on his mind and heart to guide his actions.
- ...to wait upon "the Word of God" to come to him, simply God speaking.
- ...God speaking through him to others,
- ...not just him talking or quoting scripture, but when
- ...a certain "something more" was taking place.



The Backstory: Dallas Hearing God

Chapel Preachers John R. Rice & R.R. Brown "There were giants in the land." The Divine Conspiracy Forward

After failing his class on Romans, Dallas cheated on the exam when he took the class a second time. He confessed it to his teacher then went to a revival.

At the revival as R.R. Brown prayed over Dallas, he had a deep experience with the vivid presence of God.

"It never left me really. After that, I never had the feeling that God was distant or had a problem hearing me."

"I was in a conversational relationship with Him."

1 Samuel 3:8-9 - The Ministry of Eli 1


Great Christians of the past like John Calvin and William Law offer what we might call the "Ministry of Eli".

If the Spirit of God would speak through the written Word, I could avoid being another "clever letter-learned scribe" through my own efforts from the Bible or elsewhere. (19)

Many faithful, devout Christians can make no sense of being guided by God...except by force of circumstances. God's will is fate or a brutal event, then everything is caused by God.

In the most primary of senses the word of God is simply God speaking.

Hearing God - Normal but Undisclosed

Today I continue to believe that people are meant to live in an <u>ongoing conversation with God</u> speaking and being spoken to. Adam & Eve, Enoch, and Moses are examples of the normal life God intended for us...an almost universal practice. (20-21)

But, like a UFO citing, people fear being misguided or labeled arrogant for hearing God. Many church leaders discourage the idea that God would speak to the individual. (21-22)

History is rich with hearings. (23-24)



"Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer; you shall cry for help, and He will say, Here I am...

The Lord will guide you continually."

Isaíah 58:9, 11



Abiding Includes Conversing

Jesus' reply was that He and His Father would...

"Come to them and make our home with them."

John 14:22-23

"I have called you friends." John 15:15

The Spirit who inhabits us is not mute. (25) God is not a mere benefactor, we are friends. (John 15:13)

"The Kingdom of God is among you." (Luke 17:21)

Communion and communication with God are life changing episodes and daily bread. (27)



One on One with God

Biblical - Adam, Abraham, Moses, Isaiah, Nehemiah, Mary, Peter, John, Paul Others - Augustine, Luther, Fox, Wesley, Tozer

Nothing is more central to the practical life of the Christian than confidence in God's individual dealings with each person.

The Paradox in Hearing God (30-31)

On the one hand...Massive testimony to God speaking.
On the other...Little clarity and competence hearing God.

- Confusion knowing God's will Dreadful errors •
- Force a sign from God Despair Skepticism Cynicism
 - Mechanical religious routine Religious dictators •



A Solution for Three Problem Areas

"A clear understanding and a confident, practical orientation toward God's way of guiding us and communicating with us."
(31)

1ST – God communicates with His children in many forms.

2ND — With anxiety about the future, we have wrong motives to hear God.

I fear many people seek to hear God for safety, comfort, being righteous...and avoid responsibility. God simply will not cooperate.

3RD — Misconceiving the nature of our Heavenly Father.

We miss how authority works in the Kingdom of God.

We face human troubles when thinking of God wrongly. (34)

A Conversational Relationship

Final determination: Who God is, who are we, and the nature of the relationship between us.

Our failure to hear God has its deepest roots in a failure to understand, accept and grow into a conversational relationship with God. (35)



"When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice."

John 10:4




Meditation - Samuel Hearing from God - 1 Samuel 16:1-13




